


1 pregnancy per 100 users in a year








6 to 12 pregnancies per 100 users in a year




13 or more pregnancies per 100 users





The Fallopian tubes are the main source of ovarian cancer. Removing the tubes greatly reduces your risk for cancer.

Most Effective Pregnancy Prevention



Permanent **Tubal Ligation**



Salpingectomy

A **salpingectomy** is a permanent surgery where the fallopian tubes are completely removed from your body.

99.9% PP Effectiveness

Best OC Risk Reduction

A **tubal ligation** is a permanent surgery where the fallopian tubes are blocked to prevent pregnancy.

99.5% PP Effectiveness Low OC Risk Reduction

A **vasectomy** is a permanent surgery where the sperm ducts are blocked to prevent pregnancy.

99.9% PP Effectiveness None OC Risk Reduction

Less than 1 pregnancy per 100 users







Implant

The **implant** is a small rod placed under the skin of the upper arm. It releases hormones to prevent pregnancy. It can last for up to 4 years

99% PP Effectiveness Moderate OC Risk Reduction

Hormonal IUD

A hormonal IUD is a small device inserted into the uterus that releases hormones to prevent pregnancy. It can last for 3-5 years.

99% PP Effectiveness Low OC Risk Reduction

Copper IUD

A **copper IUD** is a small device inserted into the uterus that uses copper to stop sperm from moving. It can last for 8–10 years.

Injection

The injection is a form of hormonal birth control injected into the thigh or arm once every 3 months to prevent pregnancy.

96% PP Effectiveness Moderate OC Risk Reduction

Combination Pill

The **combination pill** is a birth control medication that releases the hormones progestin and that releases the hormones progestin and estrogen to prevent pregnancy. Taken daily.

93% PP Effectiveness Moderate OC Risk Reduction

Progestin Pill

The **progestin pill** is a birth control medication that releases the hormone progestin to prevent pregnancy. Taken daily.

93% PP Effectiveness Low OC Risk Reduction



The Patch

The patch is a small, sticky patch you wear on your skin to release hormones and prevent pregnancy. Replaced weekly.

93% PP Effectiveness



Vaginal Ring

A **vaginal ring** is a plastic ring inserted into the vagina that releases hormones to prevent pregnancy. Replaced monthly

Moderate OC Risk Reduction



External Condom

An **external condom** is a thin covering worn on the penis during sex to prevent pregnancy. It also prevents STDs.

None OC Risk Reduction

87% PP Effectiveness

An **diaphragm** is a dome shaped silicone cup that fits over your cervix to prevent pregnancy. It is used with spermicide.

Internal Condom

83% PP Effectiveness

An **internal condom** is a pouch inserted into the vagina before sex to prevent pregnancy. 79% PP Effectiveness

Spermicide Spermicide is a cream, foam, or gel that kills sperm. It is inserted into the vagina before sex to prevent pregnancy.

79% PP Effectiveness None OC Risk Reduction



Cervical Cap

A **cervical cap** is a silicone or rubber cup that fits over your cervix to prevent pregnancy. It is used with spermicide.

78% PP Effectiveness None OC Risk Reduction



Fertility Planning

Fertility planning is a tracking method to predict your menstrual cycle, and the days you're most likely to get pregnant.

77% PP Effectiveness None OC Risk Reduction
